Twelve Tips to Present an Effective Webinar (Article Review)

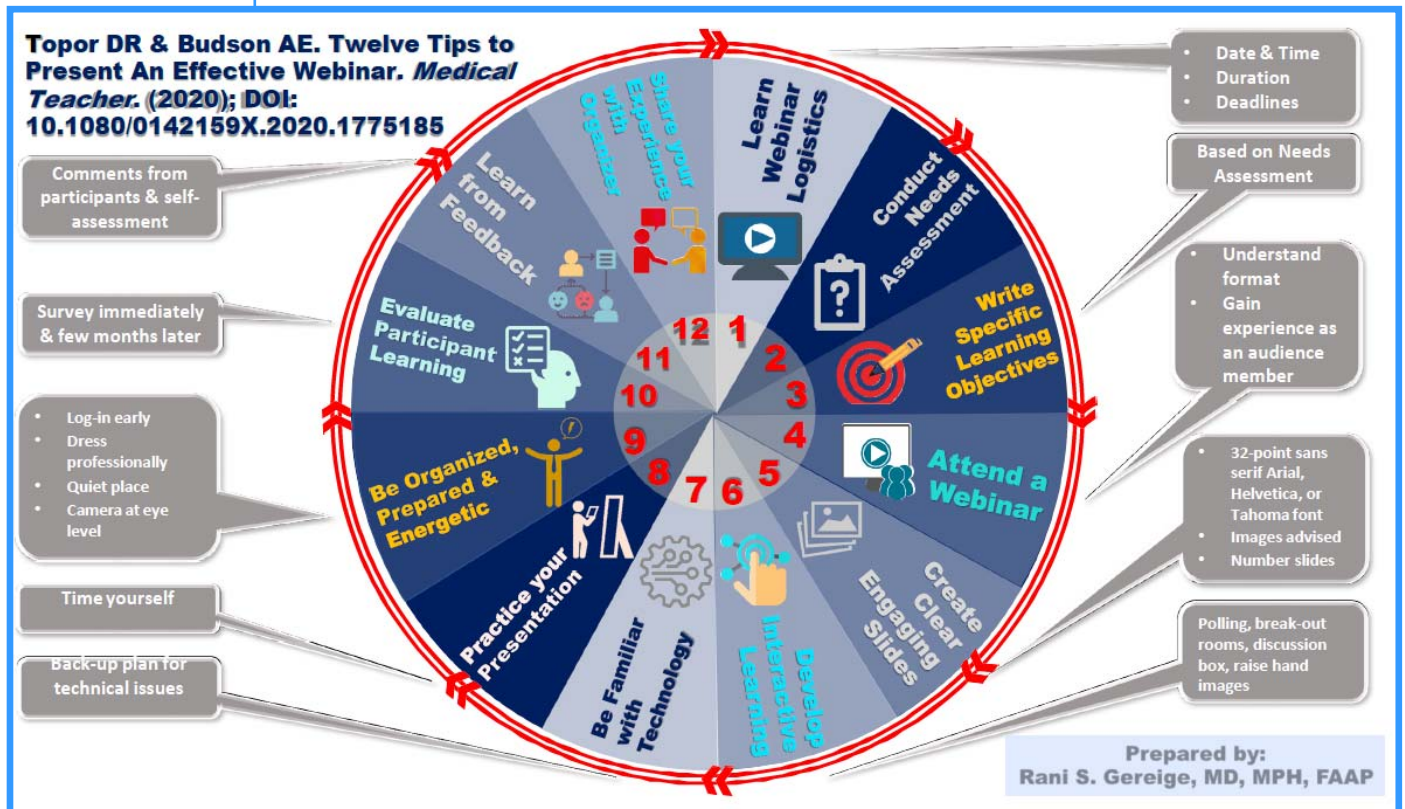


This write-up is a review summary and infographic tip sheet created by **Dr. Rani Gereige** summarizing the high points of the article by **Topor DR & Budson AE. Twelve Tips to Present an Effective Webinar. Medical Teacher. (2020); DOI: 10.1080/0142159X.2020.1775185.**

Webinars are becoming increasingly used by educators to deliver content especially after the pandemic. Webinars offer advantages in terms of wider geographic reach, decreased financial burden on both the organizer, speaker, and attendees. The authors in this article provide 12 tips for effective webinar presentations. The 12 tips are:

1. **Learn webinar logistics** (Date, time, duration, target audience)
2. **Conduct a needs assessment** (From both the organizer and potential participants)
3. **Write specific learning objectives** (Based on results of the needs assessment)
4. **Attend a webinar** (To understand the format and obtain participant's experience)
5. **Create clear, engaging slides** (Large 32-point font, simple background)
6. **Develop interactive learning activities** (Ask organizer about what interactive tools are available to you)
7. **Familiarize yourself with the technology** (Have a back-up plan with the organizer in case of technical issues)
8. **Practice your presentation** (Time yourself)
9. **Be organized, prepared, and energetic** (log early, place camera at eye level)
10. **Evaluate participant learning** (Evaluate outcomes)
11. **Learn from feedback** (Ask participants for feedback)
12. **Share your experience with the organizer** (provide the organizer with feedback)
